THE ROSS BEAR

excerpt from **ROSS, CALIFORNIA—
THE PEOPLE, THE PLACES, THE HISTORY**

WHAT IS THE STORY ABOUT THAT STRANGE LOOKING BEAR IN FRONT OF THE ROSS TOWN HALL?



Where did he live before? Well, he lived in the Flax family's front yard at Orchard Lawn, 10 Lagunitas Road across from the Ross School.

Jerome and Peggy Flax sold their property in 1971 to Richard Blum (who was later to marry Senator Dianne Feinstein). Jerry Flax was a businessman, entrepreneur, bon vivant and was widely known for making a world-class dry martini (straight up). Ross Councilman Alan Preston Maginis was walking by the Flax driveway late one afternoon when he saw his friend Jerry surrounded by several laborers preparing to load The Bear on to a truck. His friend told Maginis that he was going to donate the sculpture to the Marin Art and Garden Center. Maginis asked his friend if he might reconsider and donate the bear to the town. Maginis said he would ask for the town's approval at the next meeting to be held the following night.

Jerry suggested that they adjourn to his living room and discuss the matter further over a World Class Libation (straight up!).

The Ross Town Council gratefully accepted the gift from the Flax family by a unanimous vote on the following evening.

The Bear was the work of sculptor Beniamino (Benny) Benvenuto Bufano. Benny Bufano was a well-known San Francisco character in a city of many bearded, beret-wearing pseudo bohemians, but Benny was the genuine article. He lived barely above the poverty level

and gave away or sold (below market value) much of his work. Several people from the business community including Jerry Flax became his advisors and benefactors and saw to it that he received a fair price for his work.

Even after leaving the area Jerry would visit "his bear" and advise the town staff on its proper maintenance and care: "Polish regularly with Carnauba auto wax."

The Moya Library-Ross Historical Society released "Ross, California, The People, The Places, The History" First Edition in May 2008. It is the first comprehensive history of the Town of Ross and the surrounding valley, complete with rare early photographs and historic maps and was the research and writing project of six Moya-RHS board members/historians for over four years. – 2010 –**

In a time-honored tradition, the RPOA sponsored a Candidate's Night for the Town Council candidates, as we have done for the past 25 years. It was held April 28, 2010 at Branson School in the new Student Commons. Branson School, generously, offered the use of their facility. We estimate that about 80 people came to hear the candidates.



The candidates were Mark Fritts, Rupert Russell, Carla Small, and Iris Winey.

There was a 53% voter turnout with a total of 882 ballots cast. Carla Small and Rupert Russell were elected to the Council.

The Council announced the appointment of two Apprentice Firefighters. They are Marin residents Justin Hanson and Chris Friscia who were selected from a large pool of very qualified applicants.

ELECTION OF MAYOR

At the July 15, 2010 Town Council meeting, new council members Russell and Small were sworn in by Mayor Strauss.

Mayor Pro Tempore Hunter thanked Mayor Strauss for his past year of dedicated service. Councilman Hunter then read a statement into the record stating that for the last several decades the Ross tradition has been for the Mayor Pro Tempore to move to the Mayor position and a new Mayor ProTempore is selected. Mr. Hunter served as mayor for 11/2 years during his first term in office and at the present time cannot make the time commitment to serve again. He asked that his name be removed from the mayor position.

The Council approved the appointment of Chris Martin to the position of mayor and approved the appointment of Carla Small to the position of mayor pro tempore.

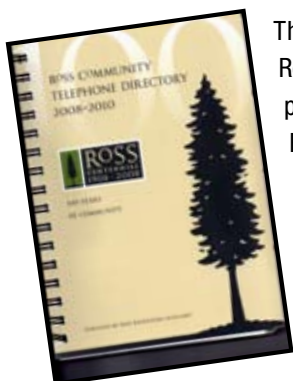
STREET TREE CANOPY RESTORATION

THE ROSS STREET TREE COMMITTEE is a newly formed volunteer group, recognized by the Town of Ross and working in concert with the Ross Public Works Subcommittee that meets monthly on the second Tuesday at 9:15 a.m. Their mission is as follows:

“Recognizing that 94% of the respondents of the 2009 Ross Town Survey considered the planting and maintenance of street trees to be an important priority, the goal of the Ross Street Tree Committee is to restore the original beauty of the tree canopy that has been the signature look of old Ross. We plan to reestablish the previous arching form of that canopy by planting single-species, disease-resistant trees in the public right-of way. We will work with the town to establish policies concerning the planting of those trees and we will work with the adjacent resident/property owner, providing maintenance guidelines intended to protect the health and longevity of those trees. Anticipating the natural life-span of trees, at approximately the half-life of the tree, we will establish an under story of younger trees that will eventually take the place of the more mature specimens.”

Current volunteers are Ann Brenner, Jennifer Leathers, BJ Martin, Chris Martin, Steven McKinney, and Dennis Untermann. The Public Works Superintendent is Robert Maccario.

GRANT DOLLARS AVAILABLE FOR REPAIR OF PRIVATE SEWER PIPES

Leaky Pipes Cause Environmental Damage and Present a Public Health Hazard

The Ross Valley Sanitary District (RVSD) advises that it is a good time to have your property sewer line inspected if you are experiencing repeated backups in shower and bath drains, slow running drains, ground settling near the lateral sewer line or large trees near the sewer line. The pipe may be damaged. The RVSD will do a pre-inspection of the area.

If repair is required, the homeowner may apply to The Lateral Replacement Grant Program for assistance with a qualified sewer lateral. This program will pay for half of the total repair cost, up to \$4000.

MUNICIPAL SERVICES TAX

Good News! The Municipal Services Tax will remain at \$775 per developed parcel for the third consecutive year. We, the citizens of Ross, originally approved this tax in 1984 to provide funds to support Public Safety and other municipal services. This tax requires voter renewal at four year intervals.
