THE LAGUNITAS ROAD BRIDGE DEDICATION

“THE SUN SHINES ON ROSS”

The March 20th dedication ceremony for our new Lagunitas Bridge was a coruscating event. After a week of worry that rain might dampen the celebration, the sun shone brightly for the festivities.



Ross resident and bagpiper, Miles Popplewell, opened the ceremony with a rendition of Liberton Pipe Band, Approximately 200 people attended with several dressing in period costumes lending an

historic feel to the proceedings.

Mayor Chris Martin opened the ceremony with remarks about the history of the original Lagunitas Road Bridge. To everyone's delight he compared the costs of the old and new bridges. Town Council and Staff, as well as the Engineering and Contracting firms who were responsible for the bridge's reconstruction were recognized. The Mayor presented the plaque identifying the historic status of the old bridge. This plaque will be installed at the southeast end of the bridge.

Colette Reidy, 16 months of age, performed the ribbon-cutting. Her mother, Lesley, and Mayor Martin gave able assistance. The Ross School Chorus sang The Rhythm of Life with lyrics customized for the occasion by Chorus Director and Ross School teacher David Howitt. The Town and The Ross Property Owners Association provided the refreshments of lemonade, champagne and cookies which were served on the Post Office lawn. Attendees received commemorative "Dedication Ceremony" tickets. These are faced with an image of a painting of the new bridge by Ross resident Sally McGivern.

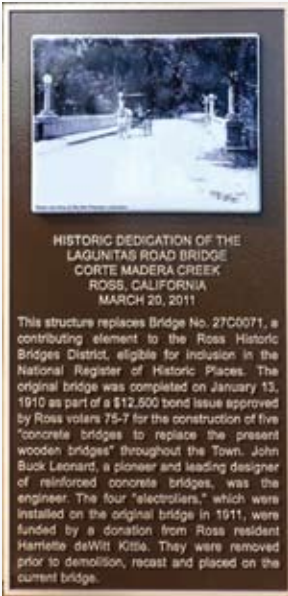

COUNCIL ACTIONS

ADVISORY DESIGN REVIEW GROUP (ADR)

At the February 2011 Town Council meeting the Council gave commendations to two retiring ADR members. They are Josefa Buckingham and Noreen Slivon who both served from February 2008 to February 2011.



They are being replaced by Peter Nelson and Dean Popplewell. The continuing members are Mark Fritts, Jim Kemp and Dan Winey.

Resolution No. 1644 sets forth the Advisory Design Review process. The ADR provides valuable "customer service" and is also helpful to Staff. The committee gives applicants professional design guidance in an informal setting at no cost to the applicant. Neighbors also benefit from this review process.

Along with the completion of our new Lagunitas Bridge, framed by beautiful magnolia trees, our town also benefits from a new pedestrian path along Sir Francis Drake Boulevard.

WEEKLY GREEN CAN PICKUP!

Marin Sanitary Service (MSS) is rolling out Ross' first residential food waste composting program to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and keep even more waste from going to the landfill. Twenty percent of the food prepared in the United States each year is thrown out.

Due to the nature of food waste, it must be picked up on a weekly basis. In Ross, bi-weekly green can pick-up will change

to weekly pick-up allowing residents to add food scraps to their green can along with yard waste.

Residents have received a "Food Scraps Guideline". This provides a list of accepted and unacceptable materials. It's very important that you post the list somewhere in your kitchen to keep unwanted materials from being placed into the green can.

Green can contents will be ground up at MSS and then transported to a specialized organic composting site in Zamora, CA. There it's processed using state-of-the-art technology to prevent the release of harmful GHGs.

Please note that 20 gal capacity cans are also available from MSS.

And remember to secure your green can with a bungee cord to thwart rodents!

working closely with staff. Many homeowners on these streets have already adopted the trees in front of their homes in honor of a loved one. Check out the Town of Ross website if you would like to adopt a tree.

Please be aware that these newly planted trees need maintenance. Please water the new trees twice a week, depending on the weather, for the next five years. After five years the trees should be able to pick up enough water from the ground to survive.

Expressing my love for Ross, I am sure that at some point in time you have heard me say, "This is my town." Truthfully, it is OUR TOWN. We create its beauty and we maintain it together. Thank you for helping me, town staff, and the Tree Committee in its stewardship. Nature, open space and our trees are the signature of Ross.

COMMUNITY EMERGENCY

RESPONSE TRAINING "CERT"

In the event of a disaster, you can be prepared to help yourself and your neighbors by taking a CERT (Community Emergency Response Training) course. A CERT course will teach basic skills to help you and your neighbors survive a natural or man made disaster or event.

In the Fall of 2010, all Marin County agencies came together to standardize their CERT programs. You may now take a class anywhere in the County and be assured that you are getting the same training and information that all trained CERT personnel receive. BURNED-OUT STREETLIGHTS

Burned out streetlight bulbs aren't being replaced in a timely manner.

In order for the bulbs to be replaced the Town has to be notified. This responsibility falls to the citizen who notices the outage. No one else is reporting these outages.

Report outages to Public Works Department Secretary Simone Jamotte at 435-1453 x106 or sjomotte@townofross.org. You must provide the pole number, which is located on the pole and ends with a capital "K" and the location of the pole ie. nearest house address. The Town then informs PGE and they replace the bulb.

Since this problem was discussed at the January 2011 Town Council meeting, Simone has reported that between January 25th. and February 3rd., 26 bulbs were replaced.
